UNDYING **NOSTALGIA**

A place exists in the Aosta Valley that stays in the heart of all those who set foot there. It's a place you visit with naive awareness, then return for a physical necessity, as if in response to a vital need.

The Irish would compare it to the nostalgia felt after visiting the land of fairies - such a heart-wrenching languor that it takes your breath away. This is exactly how you'll feel after leaving the Cogne Valley; in your mind's eye remain its verdant expanses of larch and spruce trees, the gentle slopes dotted with white lilies where chamois and marmots bound in the shade of rock cathedrals, and fox

creep stealthily across snowy glades under the stern gaze of ibex intent on guarding the mountains.

Mountains that resemble a crowd of grey giants jostling for height, overlooked by Gran Paradiso and its dizzying 4.000 metres – a white Titan whose slopes are woven with footpaths and mule tracks. The very ones used by the great Kings of Italy in past centuries, paths of untamed beauty that lead to roaring waterfalls, and boundless blooming meadows, cutting through quaint villages that overlook infinity and sparkling ski runs which are perfect for snowshoeing or skiing.

It's a delightful valley that appears to spring from a romantic water painting, so immersed in nature and respectful of the environment it deserves the title "Pearl of the Alps".

It's a valley that echoes with voices of the past, old tunnels hewn out of the rock, folk dancing to the rhythm of drums and jingles, colourful costumes parading in a swirl of lace at village festivals.

It's a land of delicious recipes and secular traditions; at its dewy feet stretch lush orchards and abundant vines whose succulent grapes admiringly watch imposing Roman and medieval ruins: colossal aqueducts and fairytale castles.

Perhaps you didn't know but here in Cogne there used to be a thriving mining industry with underground tunnels, wagons and material ropeways, and miners used to dig to the depths of the mountains to bring magnetite to the surface.

Do you want to hear some anecdotes? Then let me guide you around this land of legendary beauty, where past and present mingle, giving life to such a precious union no jewel can compare to it...



In addition to iron, also copper and silver have been extracted from Cogne mines - the highest in Europe - since the dawn of time, even by the Salassi peoples and the Romans. This historical and cultural heritage of inordinate importance has been salvaged thanks to the creation of museums and guided tours into the bowels of Mount Creya.


Here chamois nimbly scale sheer rock faces, marmot hide amongst tufts of grass and solemn ibex graze in silent, rugged pastures...

IF SPORT BECOMES HISTORY

MINES AND MINING PARK

COGNE'S HEART OF IRON

Welcome to Europe's highest magnetite mine. Here, amongst gloomy ancient tunnels and creaking

trains, you can visit an underground world where the sounds still echo of labouring miners, pick-axes chipping at the rock and rail wagons rattling by.

It's an extraordinary journey taking you to the bowels of Mount Creya, in one of the Aosta Valley's most fascinating mining parks, with over 100 kilometres of tunnels in which you

can see for yourself the work of brave

AYMAVILLES CASTLE

A FORTRESS ON THE HILL SIDE

You cannot fail to be charmed by this graceful castle that overlooks Aymavilles with four imposing crenellated towers an everlasting memory of the Challant family.

It has taken decades to restore it to its former glory: today an interesting display itinerary recounts the history of the castle's noble owners and its distinctive, prestigious architectural features, which are partly medieval, partly eighteenth century. It additionally houses wooden sculptures, jewellery, painted canvases and numerous other treasures that form part of the valuable Académie Saint-Anselme collection.









LES DENTELLIÈRES

LACEWORK

Once upon a time, in 1665, a small group of Benedictine nuns fled from Cluny to find refuge in neighbouring Aosta Valley. With them they conveyed a tradition that would soon become the symbol of Cogne: bobbin lacework.

This art requires patience, memory and precision. Considering that the techniques are handed down orally with no drawings or written instructions, it is a true miracle that the craft has survived to today. The cooperative Les Dentellières has perfected this tradition, and it is possible to admire their elegant items of hand weaving in a permanent exhibition

at Maison di Pitz.

Cogne

Begin the day with a tour of the town, exploring the delightful Meadows of Sant'Orso and the small town with its characteristic shops, cobbled square and historical iron water trough.

After having lunch in one of the many traditional restaurants, start the afternoon with a stop at roaring Lillaz waterfalls, which you can view conveniently along the short circular footpath.

Valnontey and Paradisia Garden

Continue the morning with a suggestive walk to Valnontey in the heart of Gran Paradiso National Park and then to the botanical garden, where you'll find over a thousand different plant species.

Aymavilles Castle

On returning from Cogne, round off your outing by stopping at Aymavilles Castle, which, with its prominent architecture and rich art collection, will bring you directly in touch with the noble Challant family.

DAY TWO

Exhibition Centre of Aosta Valley Mining Park and Cogne Mine



UNSPOILT SITES

LUXURIANT PURITY

Most of Cogne Valley territory lies within Gran Paradiso National Park. Therefore, it goes without saying that this spot is an explosion of stunning rugged nature, an oasis of lost splendour, where the environment is untouched and preserved in its most authentic and pure form.

That's why you may find yourself strolling amidst fox and partridges, hare and marmots, or enjoying the perfume of flowers rarely found in the Alps, while your wonder-filled eyes rest on titanic stone strongholds, sparkling expanses of ice and deafening waterfalls...



A granite cathedral with slender spires and walls scattered with pearlywhite glaciers, crowned by Gran Paradiso - the only 4,000-metre peak standing entirely within Italian territory.

It's not just a small quaint village but also a stunning 1,400 metre viewpoint: from Ozein the vista sweeps over majestic Mount Grivola and down to the entrancing panoramas of the valley floor.









MEADOWS OF SANT'ORSO

Officially recognised as an "Italian Wonder", these sweeping meadows resemble an endless emerald ocean littered with blooming anemones overlooked by snowy mountain crags.




LILLAZ WATERFALLS

Here, the crystal-clear waters of River Urtier make three spectacular drops creating a cavernous roar.
In winter these frothy webs transform into spectacular ice falls.

Get ready to walk in the midst of multicoloured butterflies, powerful rocks and wild lichens, discovering over 1,000 plant species and their fragrant secrets.

CABLEWAY RIDE TO MONTSEUC (2,100 M)

A ride on Pulsé cable car takes you over 2,000 metres altitude, where you'll find natural balconies, circular itineraries and excursions to the summit: all you have to do is take your pick!

CHAMPLONG GEOSITE

ILLAZ

In 2000 a catastrophic flood struck the Aosta Valley, causing a landslide to fall at Champlong. The consequences are still clearly visible uprooted trees, debris and clay deposits.

A network of coloured pathways varying in difficulty lead you along splendid panoramic itineraries, and along routes with information panels that help you discover the wonders of local nature.



PURE ENERGY

THE CALL OF THE MOUNTAIN

Where there's nature, there's sport, and here in Cogne sport is at its very best. Rocky cliffs turn into climbing walls, broad meadows into green treadmills, footpaths and mule tracks into wonderful trails for mountain biking, horse riding and trekking.

If summer is the queen of outdoor life, then winter must be her consort; this is the time for sports and competitions such as the Marciagranparadiso long distance cross country ski race, snowshoe excursions and ice fall climbing, all of which are sporting excellences that have brought worldwide fame to this enchanting valley.

Wherever you go in the Aosta Valley the food is good, but the Cogne Valley deserves a special mention: some of the region's top restaurants are located here, in an area which has been able to express its most intense and audacious notes, leaving tables spread with irresistible delicacies.

The key ingredients of mountain cuisine – wholemeal bread, cheese, red wine and cured meats –encounter liqueurs, legumes and cereals to create delicious and surprising combinations that reflect Alpine life and its authentic traditions.

Aymavilles' thirty-five hectares of vineyards make it an endless source of top quality wine. Don't miss Torrette DOC, which pairs excellently with meat and cheese.

Once it was made from chamois thigh muscle but now beef is used. This cured meat has an unmistakable flavour and is a culinary must when visiting Cogne, preferably with some rye bread.

Made of iron extracted from the town mines, this trough and its melodious chant have kept watch over the people of Cogne for more than two hundred years, and never tires of reflecting the mountains' clear gaze.

Cogne's Gran Paradiso National Park Visitor Centre featuring interactive and multimedia displays is housed in an old village.

SKYWAY: A REFUGE ON TOP OF THE SKY

Skyway is one of the most impressive cable cars on earth and an extraordinary feat of engineering that carries passengers to a height of almost 3,000 metres – a stone's throw from Mont Blanc peak.
